Rabies is an acute viral infection that can affect all mammals. The disease is almost always caused by the bite of an infected animal that has rabies virus in its saliva. It's always fatal once clinical signs appear.¹

What if my cat has possibly been exposed?

If your cat has been bitten by or exposed to a wild or potentially rabid animal, talk with your veterinarian immediately and report it to local animal control authorities. Even if your cat has a current rabies vaccination, it's still important to contact your veterinarian.



Once the rabies virus enters the body, it travels along the nerves to the brain. It can take a matter of days, weeks or months for an infected animal to show signs of rabies.¹

Infected cats may show sudden behavioral changes in temperament, aggression and signs of apprehension. Seizures and tremors that can lead to paralysis are also common.

Unvaccinated cats that are exposed to a rabid animal may need to be euthanized or placed in strict isolation for six months.¹ Check with your veterinarian or local public health official for requirements.
